

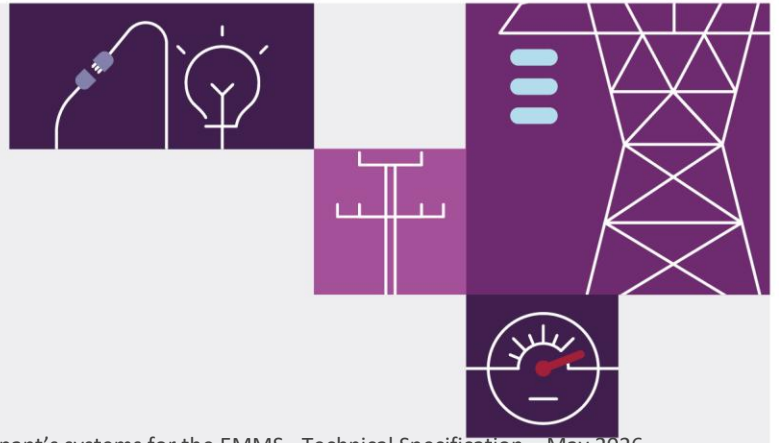

4 NEMWeb Platform Migration

4.1 Goal

We are migrating the platform supporting NEMWeb on Monday 18 May 2026. While we aim to complete the migration seamlessly, you may notice a brief service interruption on the day of the migration.

Before the migration, the following changes are introduced:

- Migration from HTTP to HTTPS for NEMWeb URLs on Tuesday 7 April 2026.
- pdrBatcher update to support case sensitive URLs.

5 NEMWeb URL Case Sensitivity

The NEMWeb platform migration on Monday 18 May 2026, introduces case sensitivity for subdirectories when accessing NEMWeb data.

The base URLs /Reports/CURRENT/, /Reports/ARCHIVE/ and /Data_Archive remain case-insensitive. You can use any combination of upper- or lower-case characters when accessing these base paths. For example, the following URLs work after the production release:

- <https://www.nemweb.com.au/RepORTs/cuRRENT/>
- <https://www.nemweb.com.au/REpoRts/ARchivE/>
- https://nemweb.com.au/Data_ARCHIVE/https://nemweb.com.au/Data_Archive/

For content within these base paths, all subdirectories and files are now case-sensitive. You must use the exact directory and file name case listed in NEMWeb.

For example:

- Correct: https://www.nemweb.com.au/Reports/CURRENT/Adjusted_Prices_Reports/
- Incorrect: https://www.nemweb.com.au/Reports/CURRENT/Adjusted_Prices_REPORTS/

Requests succeed when the base URL uses any casing, provided that all subdirectories and files names use the exact case as listed in NEMWeb. For example, this URL works:

- https://www.nemweb.com.au/RepORTs/cuRRENT/Adjusted_Prices_Reports/

Report and directory names remain unchanged. The change enforces case sensitivity only for subdirectories and files beneath the base paths.

5.1 What you need to do

Update any tools or scripts that do not preserve subdirectory and file name case. Ensure all requests use the exact case as listed in NEMWeb.

If you use pdrBatcher to download from NEMWeb, apply the pdrBatcher v7.6.1.3 patch to support case sensitive URLs. See [Updated pdrBatcher](#).

5.2 Impact if you do not change

If you do not make the required updates, requests to NEMWeb subdirectories or files may fail after the migration.



6 Decommissioning HTTP Support

To improve platform security, NEMWeb switches to HTTPS on Tuesday 7 April 2026. All existing connections using HTTP must switch to HTTPS. The following examples show how existing URLs change:

6.1 What you need to do

Switch all URLs to HTTPS by Tuesday 7 April 2026. Update any scripts, tools or bookmarks that use `http://` to use `https://`.

6.2 Impact if you do not change

If you continue using HTTP after Tuesday 7 April 2026, your requests or automated downloads may fail.



7 Updated pdrBatcher

A patch for pdrBatcher v7.6.1 supporting case-sensitive ULRs is available on Thursday 26 February 2026. Apply this patch to keep automated downloads working during and after the migration.

Note: This patch is only for pdrBatcher v7.6.1.

7.1 What you need to do

- If you use pdrBatcher v7.6.1 to download from NEMWeb, apply the patch released on Thursday 26 February 2026. AEMO sends a notification email once the patch is available.
- If you use an earlier version of pdrBatcher, you must:
 - Upgrade to pdrBatcher v7.6.1
 - Apply the pdrBatcher v7.6.1.3 patch published on Thursday 26 February 2026.
- Update any other tools or scripts that do not preserve the exact case of NEMWeb filenames, so they fetch files using the correct filename case after the platform migration.

Update your configurations to use HTTPS before upgrading pdrBatcher.

7.2 Impact if you do not change

Older pdrBatcher versions will not reliably download files after the NEMWeb platform migration.

8 Report Management Framework (post-production)

We introduce a three-phased framework to identify and discontinue:

- Superseded reports: Reports replaced by another, preferred report.
- Outdated reports: Reports that are no longer maintained in line with the latest market rules or where the original need for the report does not exist.

This process takes effect after the production date of Monday 18 May 2026.

8.1 Phase 1 – Discontinuation notice

We publish reports planned for discontinuation, including their replacement reports where applicable. See [Discontinued reports](#). Review the published information and update your systems, scripts and data feeds to use the preferred replacement report.

8.2 Phase 2 – Legacy access period

After the NEMWeb platform migration production date, we publish the discontinued report relocation date. On this date:

- NEMWeb moves [Discontinued reports](#) from their current location to a legacy subfolder under <https://nemweb.com.au/Reports/>.
- The original URLs no longer provide access to these reports. Access continues through the legacy sub-folder location.

If you have not made the changes in phase 1, any data feeds still pointing to the original URL will stop working.

A six-month legacy access period applies from the report relocation date. During this period, you can access the discontinued reports from the legacy subfolder. We provide a mapping of the original URLs to the legacy URLs in a future release of this technical specification.

8.3 Phase 3 – Report retirement

At the end of the legacy access period, NEMWeb permanently removes [Discontinued reports](#). We send regular reminder notices during the legacy access period to support participants in completing the transition.

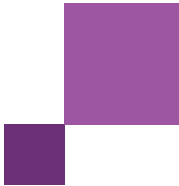
